<p><b>Flower Centers</b> - any mixture of golds for: crocus, rose, dogwood - adding a few lines French knots in dogwood center.</p> <p>An inverted V for <b>violets</b> in gold which shows up best.</p>	<p>Gold (honeysuckle yellow ) 690, 3, 5, 6</p>

<b>Trunk</b>	Brown 950,1,3,7
<b>Leaves</b> (arbutus, crocus, iris) Add 1 string dusty rose to this.	Cool Green (grey green) 350, 2. 5
All remaining leaves are warm green	Warm Green - olive 240,1,3,5 <b>or</b> drab olive 330,2,3,5 <b>or</b> brown olive 310,1,3,5

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## Accents

Do centres of <i>Dogwood</i> leaves (two turquoise & one gold or vice versa). Do <i>hillock</i> somewhere to the left and <i>butterfly</i> wings (leaving a piece open to take gold, #997 if you use Appleton's). Use lightest shade for wing on bug on branch		

[2013: **Charts 1** and **2** were part of Fran's original and revised instructions; **Chart 3** was part of the revised instructions; **Charts 4** and **5** were an additional handout accompanying the transfer.

The final chart indicates the Appleton yarns that would be suitable for the territorial flowers.

The numbers listed are directly from the original information: some appear not to match the current numbering system, for instance, Dusty Rose is indicated as 145, but in the Appleton on-line chart is 140; and the Appleton colour for the trunk (Chart 5), 920, is not brown. But these colours are just a starting point: as Fran said, "feel free to express yourself — Enjoy!"
